


### What is Bats?

"I wanted to write a play about the twentieth century, economics, and men; and it turned into Gagarin Way. A comedy. I didn't expect it to be a comedy but when you consider the themes which emerged while I wrote it - Marxist and Hegelian theories of history, anarchism, psychopathology, existentialism, mental illness, political terrorism, nihilism, globalisation and the crisis in masculinity - then it couldn't really be anything else."

So says Gregory Burke of his debut play; a tough, courageous, highly verbal and very clever comedy, which stunned audiences when it appeared at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival (2001) winning a fistful of awards and excellent reviews wherever it has played.

## The NZ premiere production of Gagarin Way opens at BATS Theatre on April 14.




## Gorilla

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



a final chance to see this acclaimed production first presented during the STAB season of 2002.

the telescope is a love story starring Peter Rutherford as an agoraphobic astronomer on the verge of a major discovery. Having found a previously unknown dying star, he has calculated the exact moment of supernova. Using this occasion as inspiration he decides to express his hidden affections for a colleague. As he awaits her arrival he listens to the radio...

'eye-catchingly cinematic' 'dark and atmospheric'

Featuring live music from Wellington lounge act HUM, the telescope tells its story through visual and aural signatures, with high production values placed on both the staging and sound design. In her review, Lynn Freeman describes the music from Sebastian Morgan-Lynch, Steve Gallagher, Matt Hutton and Miranda Manasiadis as 'achingly beautiful', with Timothy O'Brien highlighting the sound as 'beautifully underscoring the emotions which the astronomer is restrained from showing'.

The stage and light design from martyn roberts enhances further the illusion of a different time and space in which the main character resides. Timothy O'Brien again -'Martyn Roberts' production places the action within a cinemascope box - showing the influence of Robert LePage in this as in its storytelling means'. Using light like a camera, the telescope is a truly cinematic experience, carefully paced with a strong emotional punch.

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# YOUNG + HUNGRY

Presents its tenth anniversary of plays

TEN YEARS YOUNG (LITERALLY)

Conceived in Auckland, born in Wellington. A youth project at the Maidment Theatre inspired Guy Boyce to apply for an Arts Council grant in 1993 to put on a season of one act plays at BATS. He received just over twenty thousand dollars to commission and produce four new scripts for 15-25 yr olds.

Cue Conrad Newport, producer of the first festival of plays TEN YEARS AGO in 1994. Including writers Danny Mulheron, Riwia Brown, Jean Betts & Garv Henderson and Young & Hungry is a happening thing.

Ten years, 37 playwrights, five producers, and a cast and crew of thousands later and Young & Hungry is still going strong. The focus is now on three main professional development programmes for 15-25 year-olds - the annual Festival of Plays at BATS Theatre, the Playwrights Commission and the Young & Hungry Ambassadors Programme.

To celebrate this amazing feat of double figures we have selected three of our all time favourite Young & Hungry commissioned scripts to restage in the Tenth Anniversary Festival. ENJOY...


